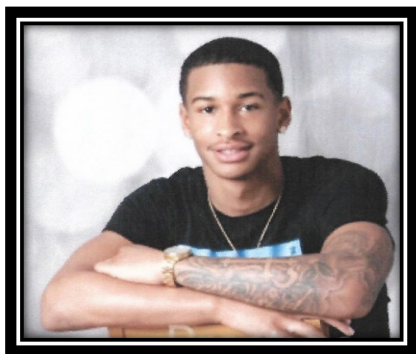


2025 Scholarship Ceremony Speakers
