She served two four-year terms as Mayor ProTem/Town Commissioner from 2001-2009. After the 2016 flood, Isabelle relocated to Fayetteville, NC where she works as a Professional Health Caregiver with Home Instead.

She expresses that the greatest gift she has ever received is her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. She is very thankful for her daughter, Jessuita; her son-in-law, Derek; her three grandchildren Jakevion; Kiara who is graduating from Reid Ross Classical School (June 2024) and a CHSAA Scholarship recipient; and her youngest, Mikayla Williams.
